


O God, the protector of all who trust in you,

And finally a reminder, from Dave Walker a talented cartoonist



At this time when we cannot go to church to worship together, having some resources for prayer may help us to continue to be connected to one another and to God.

If you would like to borrow a BCP prayer book, hymn book or Bible then please speak to Jane (01458 223417). I won't be able to talk to you, but I can drop one off in a plastic bag for you.

There are several daily prayer apps that you may be able to use from your tablet or Smart Phone if you have one:

- Search for Aimer Media from your app store, and choose Daily Prayer or Time to Pray.
- Lectio 365 is an app that takes you through a Psalm, reading and prompts for prayer, just search for Lectio365 from your App Store.

If you don't have access to a smart phone or Computer, why not read the Bible. I suggest you start with the Gospel or Mark or Luke, or if you would like an Old Testament story then Ruth and Esther are good places to begin.
