"Jesus Lives: Follow Him" Sunday 20 February 2022 2nd Sunday before Lent

Sunday's Gospel speaks of Jesus' power over a storm, in a week when our country has been hit by two storms, I'm writing in the lull between them, without knowledge as to the full effects!

Storms can, however, be fearsome things. Walking on Dartmoor a couple of weeks ago, one day we were in strong winds, and it was difficult to move when walking into them, cold when we stopped and if I'm honest slightly scary too. Strong winds are respected by the most experienced of sailors and fishermen including the disciples who were used to the sudden storms on the Sea of Galilee.

On this occasion Jesus, once he has been woken up, calms the storm causing the disciples to ask themselves: 'who is this, that he commands even the wind and the water, and they obey him?'

Who is this?

Were they I wonder thinking of Psalm 107 which speaks of the people of God encountering difficulty, for example: during their wanderings, delivered from darkness, healed from sickness and storms calmed. In each case the people cry out to the Lord in their trouble, and he answers them, resulting in praise and thanksgiving.

I wonder how we cry out to God in trouble, and how we respond when it feels as if He is asleep in the boat. But I wonder too if we respond to what He does with thanksgiving, watching out for and recognising him at work in situations. The results may not be as dramatic as in our Gospel or Psalm 107, but God is still there and God is still working so let us thank him and call out to him in our need.
