"Jesus Lives: Follow Him" Sunday 26 June 2022 Trinity 2/St Peter's Day

This Sunday in Lydford we will be celebrating St Peter's Day. St Peter is of course famous as the leader of the disciples, the one who was the first to declare that Jesus was indeed the Messiah, the one they were looking for.

But he is also the first to declare that Jesus' call to suffering and crucifixion cannot be true, and that even if everyone else turns away he will not.

In other words Peter has, at times, a misplaced confidence in what he thinks he knows and this can lead him into hot water....

Peter also encourages us that there is no-where away from God's love. When he denies Christ we're told that Jesus turns to look at him, my belief is that is a look of love not condemnation. Jesus of course also walks with him on the beach and reinstates him, encouraging him to follow and take care of others who follow.

So what can we learn from Peter today:

- To be bold in our faith, ready to declare what we believe
- To recognise when our boldness has taken us in the wrong direction and return to Christ
- To be prepared to follow Jesus for our lives, wherever that may take us.

As we follow Jesus may we learn from the example of Peter and others.
