Route1 helps children have happy childhood memories, and ensures their views are listened to and acted upon.



Lydford and District Gardening Club

In the book 'Cautionary Tales for Children', Hilaire Belloc warns of the dangers of straying from one's Nurse in the story of Jim, who did just that and was eaten by a lion. This is a fine example in a long tradition of moral writing whereby the perilous outcomes of

certain actions are emphasised in order to help regulate the conduct of specific parts of the population - mainly, though not exclusively, children.

Gardening is not big on such writing but what follows may be food for thought. With the very best of good neighbourly intentions and following in a long line of similarly considerate acts, a member of the Club was disturbed by the unkempt nature of the grass verges of two properties opposite their own.

They were out mowing their own expanse and felt that the least that they could do would be to just nip over the road and cut the other swards in order to make the place look a bit tidier. Obviously, being a bit of a gardener they knew to leave the daffodil leaves as the bulbs need to gain a bit of goodness from these leaves for good flowering next year. It was then the work of a few moments to trim these 'unsightly' bits of lawn to a more sensible length and the mower was then put back into the shed until the next time it was needed.

However, when in conversation with someone outside the village on the next day a simple, three word phrase entered the discussion and began to make connections which had not been made before. For the first time ever, our lawnmowing hero heard the words 'no-mow-May' linked together to provide an inkling as to what might have been going on and how 'the road to hell may indeed be paved with the best of good intentions'.

So, if you want to help your fellow villagers with a bit of considerate grass cutting, it might be a good idea to just have a brief chat first and make sure that the longish grass is due to idleness or incompetence or the lawnmower being in the workshop of the Somerton Mower Man and not part of some green, ecofriendly, insect-loving attempt at a bit of re-wilding!

Refreshments were, as ever, biscuit based. Three varieties of homemade marvels were on offer, all as gorgeous as each other.

Next Meeting

The June meeting of the home-made biscuit club with a bit of gardening thrown in, is on Tuesday, 11th at 19.00ish in the Parish Hall and the speaker is to be Sally Nex. She has spoken before and been very impressive. Her topic will be 'Growing Fruit', something which has not been on the menu for a good few years, indeed, if ever!

It was very pleasing to see the Hall so full in May to the extent that extra chairs had to be excavated from the bowels of the stage and it is to be hoped that Sally will have an equally impressive audience. Early thoughts about the variety of biscuits on offer are edging towards some fruit based confections. Red-currant shortbread perhaps?

Some useful advice from the Police to help prevent burglary Especially during the summer holidays!

Ensure that all doors and windows are closed and properly locked – use a key, don't just lift the door handle. Take the keys out of the door when it's locked and put them somewhere out of sight and reach, but make sure all the residents know where they are kept in case of emergency.



- Sheds, garages and outbuildings are popular targets for burglars, so increase the security to these whenever possible. Check that the contents of these places are included on our home and contents insurance.
- Register your belongings on the Immobilise property register. If anything, lost or stolen is handed to the police you have a good chance of getting your property returned.
- Restrict access to the rear of your property wherever possible lock any side gates leading to the rear – as the back or patio doors are the most popular site of forced entry. Think about growing some thorny bushes along the garden fencing.
- Lock away ladders or any tools that could help a burglar and secure any garden furniture or wheelie bins that can be moved to help gain access to an extension or first floor window.
- If you're taking the car with you, ask a neighbour to use your driveway while you are away to make the home look occupied.
- Cut the lawn and keep the garden tidy. Long grass suggests that the house is empty, or the occupant is unable to look after the garden.
- Consider installing a burglar alarm they are a real deterrent but get an approved or recommended model, as the cheap ones aren't really that reliable and if the alarm keeps going off your neighbours will soon lose interest and may ignore a real activation.
 - Don't forget to cancel any milk, newspaper, or regular delivery

The Gift of Prayer

It is a great joy and privilege to come and join you here in Bath and Wells as the new Dean of Wells, to serve the Cathedral, the diocese and the county. This is an area with strong links on my maternal side, with my grandparents being married in Bath, and many relatives from around this patch.

One of the many things which drew me to this role is the privilege of prayer in your beautiful Cathedral Church. Each morning we gather and pray for the life of the diocese, and give thanks for that same life in the evening. Please be assured of my prayers for you in your mission and ministry and I warmly look forward to getting out to explore the diocese.

As I reflect on this time of change, I am mindful of the importance of finding patterns of prayer to sustain our lives, and nourish our spiritual growth. As Archbishop Desmond Tutu said many years ago, we must 'think of prayer as a relationship.' We are to invest in it, and to find space so that it can develop, and this takes time. Or as the mystic Evelyn Underhill put it, 'On every level of life, from housework to heights of prayer, in all judgement and efforts to get things done, hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur.'

We all know the importance of taking time to invest in relationships, and I love the challenge that hurry and impatience are sure marks of the amateur. As we reflect on our own prayer lives, I wonder if there are ways that we can deepen our relationship in prayer? The Christian tradition is packed with ways to help people learn to pray. Maybe we can find ways to slow ourselves down and be more present to the gift of prayer, so that we may join in the Apostle Paul's prayer, 'we have not ceased to pray for you, asking that you may be filled with the knowledge of God's will in all spiritual wisdom and understanding'. (Colossians 1.9)




