### **Dear friends**

It is that time of year when moving around our villages there are piles of apples and other fruit and veg on the roadside, tractors with grain or straw behind them and whilst we have had some glorious days, the evenings are drawing in and getting darker. Keats writes of this time of year in his poem To Autumn:

> Season of mists and mellow fruitfulness, Close bosom-friend of the maturing sun; Conspiring with him how to load and bless With fruit the vines that round the thatch-eves run; To bend with apples the moss'd cottage-trees, And fill all fruit with ripeness to the core; To swell the gourd, and plump the hazel shells With a sweet kernel; to set budding more, And still more, later flowers for the bees, Until they think warm days will never cease, For Summer has o'er-brimm'd their clammy cells.

Harvest is the culmination of the work of planting, tending and then cutting the crops. Some years it is good, there is no shortage and barns and grain stores overflow. Other years it is less good. This year we've had plenty (maybe too much at times) of rain and not a huge amount of sun. I know that some apple crops are down, others too have planted differently to cope with the weather.

So how do we respond to this? We've had the wrong sort of weather at the wrong time, all year, too hot or too cold, too wet or too dry. Whilst gardens might have thrived no amount of 'tending' can recompense for all the issues arising from the wrong weather at the wrong time!

So maybe our response is twofold:

- Seeking, insofar as we are able, to live with an awareness of the impact of our lives, particularly through: consumption, travel, food choices etc and mitigating those impacts where possible.
- As a part of that supporting British and local farmers and producers, buying local where possible and supporting our local communities and businesses.

I would then like to add a third to that which is to suggest that we also recall our creator God who makes and sustains the world and everything in it. We're looking forward to gathering together for harvest on 13<sup>th</sup> October and following that with lunch in Keinton Village hall. Despite everything we can still give thanks

We can still remember that no matter how small (or large) the harvest is we have food on our plates and roofs over our heads and give thanks for that, whilst continuing to find ways to eat tomatoes, courgettes and apples (or whatever you have a glut of) or maybe sharing them with friends and neighbours.





Our volunteer driving scheme, by and for the residents of Keinton Mandeville. Kingweston, Lydford and Barton St. David, has proved so successful that we are struggling to keep up with the demand for our services. As a result, we are seeking drivers who could spare a few hours a month to join our team. *Drivers* are paid 45p per mile (the Government approved mileage rate) for each drive undertaken.

The scheme is available to help out those who do not drive or have their own transport or those for whom public transport (if it is available) is difficult to access. It can be used for, but not necessarily restricted to, journeys up to 25 miles each way to: the doctor; hospital (if free transport is not available); the post office; shopping; friends or relatives (including when in hospital); bus stops; bus stations or railway stations for onward journeys. ### **Lydford on Fosse Parish Council**

### Lydford on Fosse Parish Council September Meeting.

The meeting was held on  $4^{th}$  September in the Parish Hall. The following issues were covered:

- Cllr. Debbie Steel agreed to take over the PC's Highways & Transportation portfolio.
- Although our Somerset Councillor, Claire Sully, wasn't able to attend the meeting, she sent a report which included a consultation on possible changes to the Council Tax Reduction Support for working age adults on low incomes; a partnership to boost heat pump installations in Mendip South, including an offer of £7,500 per household; and Suicide Prevention work in the county. Details for those interested can be found under 'News Snippets from Somerset Council' in the 'Latest News' section of the Parish website.
- A request to vary the design of a new residence to be built on Mardi's Lane was recommended for approval by the PC.
- Notification was received that the recent application to install an illuminated advertising display at Lydford Filling Station, close to the A37, had been approved by Somerset Council (SC) despite the PC's recommendation that it be refused.
- Details have been received from SC of a pilot scheme to allow Parish & Town Councils to purchase highway maintenance services, such as road sign cleaning, pot-hole filling and hedge trimming, from their highways contractor, Keir. The PC will request some sample costings to help them to assess the value and benefit of the scheme to the Parish.
- Recent concerns over the placement of a large Greggs' sign by the exit from Lydford Filling Station were discussed. The PC have already engaged with SC Highways Department and the Filling Station's headquarters about the associated hazard due to reduced visibility of southbound traffic. After the meeting, the Filling Station's owners advised that they accepted the concerns raised and would move the sign as soon as they could arrange to do so.
- A highly informative presentation was received about the equipment and work of the Speedwatch team, and their involvement with Avon & Somerset Police and the wider Mendip Speedwatch community.
- The Neighbourhood Watch team advised of a break-in to the garden shed of a residence on the B3153 on the border between Lydford & Keinton. Security cameras were evaded, padlocks cut, and some items stolen.
- The PC agreed to ask the company currently engaged in cutting the Sports Field's grass to also remove the weeds and trim the hedges around the Playground.
- The PC's internal audit will shortly fall due. Unfortunately, the previous auditor is leaving the area and, after several years of excellent support, is no longer able to provide their services. The PC's Clerk is therefore looking to engage a new auditor. If you are interested, or know of someone who may be, please contact the Clerk at <code>lofpcclerk@amail.com</code>.

The next PC meeting is scheduled to take place on *Wednesday*, 9<sup>th</sup> October, in the Parish Hall, starting at 7:00pm.

- If you live in a house that's entirely powered by electricity, you won't need a carbon monoxide detector. But if you have a fuel (gas, LPG, oil, wood) burning boiler, fire or stove, you should have one in every room where the fuel is burned.
- Check the date on your carbon monoxide (CO) detector. Replace any CO detector older than five years.
- You can't see, smell or taste carbon monoxide so you need to be able to recognise the symptoms of CO poisoning – headache, breathlessness, confusion, dizziness, nausea and fatigue – it can feel like a dose of the flu!

### A light which shines in the darkness

The custodial sentences imposed on many of those involved in the recent riots in communities across our country have highlighted, yet again, the issue of criminal justice and the pressures and strains within the prison system.

The seemingly ever-increasing size of the prison population; the appalling conditions within many of our older prisons, especially those in our inner cities; the almost total lack of provision for education and rehabilitation and an apparent unwillingness by those elected to Parliament to consider whether the whole of our justice system needs a radical overhaul have all resulted in much media comment.

But one part of the prison system which has not been mentioned is the invaluable role played by those who serve as Chaplains. Prison and restorative justice have been a constant thread almost throughout the whole of my life beginning with my first visit while still in my teens to what was then called a

Since then, I've had the privilege of working with chaplaincy teams across the whole of the prison estate. I've witnessed at first hand the extraordinary work done those teams, lay and ordained, of all faiths, working together to witness to God's love in Christ and caring for all those in the prison system, both staff and prisoners. I've often said to those on the outside, if you want to know what true collaborative ministry looks like in practice, look no further than a chaplaincy team. While each member remains true to his or her particular faith, the barriers which often divide people of faith have no part in that shared work of witness and service.

Sadly, all too often, the work of Chaplaincies not just in prison but in all aspects of our human life, in education, hospital, mental health, care homes and many other places, is barely known - that is, until we need their care. But Chaplaincies are the yeast which leaven our society. The light which shines in the darkness. Society, as we long and pray for it to be, would be the poorer without them.

#### News in brief – October 2024 24-hour Wave of Prayer

For 24 hours, a wave of prayer spread across the Diocese of Bath and Wells, as people came together to pray for the growth of church and the transformation of their communities. Events took place right across Somerset, from intimate prayer gatherings in homes and churches to outdoor events and online prayer walls.

The Archbishop of Canterbury joined the wave travelling from Bath to Wells, then on to Bridgwater, Nailsea and Frome. He met and prayed with young people. farmers in an agricultural market, he met church communities and shared in prayer with them, and he opened a newly created prayer space. Elsewhere churches held their own events as they came together in prayer with and for their communities.

### On 20<sup>th</sup> October Bishop Michael will speak at Evensong at the Minster.

Local artists have donated works for the exhibition that illustrate the realities of modern slavery. It's hoped the power of art will help convey the urgent and often hidden nature of this human crisis.




