Christmas is often challenging. We have the challenge of the 'perfect family' as portrayed in advertisements. The challenge of the ideal meal and table setting in magazine or television programmes. The challenge of our desired time and the reality of the present time.

In *The Message* which is a paraphrase of the Bible speaking old words into contemporary society. Sometimes it is a bit American, sometimes it doesn't work. But sometimes it hits the nail on the head and this verse is one of those times.

'The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighbourhood. We saw the glory with our own eyes, the one of a kind glory, like Father, like Son, Generous inside and out, true from start to finish' John 1:14 The Message





Lydford and District Gardening Club

The surname 'Morgan' is apparently of Welsh or Irish, certainly Celtic, origin and essentially means in some way relating to the sea. 'Sea-born' is probably as good as it gets and the majority of people in this country who enjoy the appellation are to be found in the south-west. Famous 'Morgans' are to be found in a wide variety of roles and occupations. In gardening terms the Morgan in the seed firm 'Thompson and Morgan' was a 19th century businessman who latched on to the horticultural talents of Mr. Thompson and developed the company into a major money-making institution. Willie Morgan was a poor man's George Best. A talented winger who went from Burnley to Manchester United and achieved great things on the field of play and, perhaps more importantly, managed to avoid some of the pubs and clubs which were so tempting to players of his generation. Willie has been awarded the M.B.E for services to charity and also had a song written about him by the group 'Tristar Airbus' which was a band from the 10.C.C. stable in Manchester.

Also from the sporting world is Eoin Morgan, a cricketer who has played for Ireland and England and has proven to be a major force in the world of limited over matches. Born in Dublin, Eoin played a lot of Hurling as a young person and has credited this game with having a major part in the development of his reverse-sweeping ability.

Those with no sporting interest can start reading again at this point as we consider the career of Sir Henry Morgan who lived from 1635 to 1688. He was a privateer, if you are English, or a pirate if you have an Iberian identification. Sailing around the Caribbean during the 17th century, Henry was very busy, made a lot of money and upset a lot of people. However, his lasting fame is mostly due to the fact that the 'Captain Morgan' brand of rum is named after this character. So the next time that a generous slug of such spirit is added to a mug of coffee - 'just to keep out the cold' - think about the derivation of the name which is still on the Diageo bottle.

And finally, before Morgan overload sets in, J.P. Morgan was an American financial wizard who died in 1913 leaving an estate valued in current terms, at \$3 Billion. However, what is really important about this chap is that his uncle, James Pierpoint, has to take responsibility at this time of year for being the composer of 'Jingle Bells'!

November Meeting & AGM

Sally Morgan, a published horticultural author was the speaker at the November meeting of the Gardening Club. She had shown her good manners by sitting through the A.G.M. without so much as a whisper in protest at being forced to listen to such dull fare. Indeed she made reference to the fact that other organisations had such meetings lasting for 2 hours or more! 10 minutes was more than enough for the L.D.G.C. and it would appear that the last year has been good and things look well set for the next one.

Ms. Morgan then took the stage and launched into her presentation on the topic of 'Gardening for Climate Change'. In future years it could be drier. However, it might well be wetter. There is a very good chance that it will be warmer in winter but this might mean that some fruit trees will not get the cold that they need to ensure good blossom formation and fruit set. Peat really is not the way forward and potting compost can be made from a mixture of molehill loam, leaf mould and home-made garden compost. Her message was presented in a forthright fashion and gave many pointers as to how things are likely to change.

December is always associated with the *Club Christmas dinner* and this is to be held on *Monday*, 9th *December at the Cross Keys Inn*. Timings, in the traditional form, are 7:00pm for 7:30pm and anyone who has not yet booked their place can contact a member of the committee to remedy that deficiency!

And so to 2025 – The first meeting of the year will be on January 14th and someone from Brimsmore will be coming to talk about the story of the process whereby plants are grown, nurtured and then offered for sale in garden centres. From seed to shopping trolley and all steps in between! The speaker will probably be grateful to leave the world of Christmas decorations and return to plants! Copies of the programme for 2025 will be available as should seeds from D.T. Brown. And, of course, biscuits!
