'Consider the birds of the air.... Consider the lilies of the field'

I'm writing this just before the RSPB Garden Birdwatch weekend, and our Snowdrop extravaganza on $1^{\rm st}$ February from $11:00 \, \rm am - 2:00 \, pm$ in Keinton Churchyard.

February is not usually a month when we're out looking at flowers or birds, too cold and damp. But giving ourselves the time and space to do so can also help us and bring hope. As February progresses, we see increasing evidence of the arrival of spring. Bulbs grow and begin to flower; we see evidence of leaves returning to trees (even if there are none yet!), birdsong becomes louder and clearer, the days get longer and slightly warmer. There is renewed evidence of life and hope.

So do we take the time to 'consider' the birds, the flowers and the world around us, not because we're worshipping nature but because nature can teach us so much:

- Birds have food without planting
- Flowers grow and bloom even if no-one can see them, their beauty is there anyway
- They can be relied upon to be there (even if in fewer numbers than previous years)
- They bring so much variety to life
- We can appreciate them when we take the time to do so, rather than just rushing onto the next event.

Jesus tells his followers to consider the birds and the flowers because they speak of God's love, care and compassion. They do not sow or reap, or have long lives that impact many people and yet they are there.

Sometimes we're not sure that we can see God's love and compassion, things go wrong, we deal with illness or challenge and we can wonder where God is in that. At those times too considering the birds and flowers reminds us that he does still care for us and is still present, even when we're finding it harder to believe.

So as winter progresses, and we start to see signs of life and spring maybe we can all take the time to enjoy our surroundings, consider the birds and the flowers and ask ourselves 'How have I seen the love of God today'?

Keinton Mandeville Village Hall and Playing Field

Our village hall is well used, and at 27 years old is subject to the inevitable wear and tear. Along with routine maintenance and upgrading, the hall committee are working on improvements to benefit Keinton's growing community. Last year we fixed 45 solar panels to the hall roof, with two storage batteries in the basement. Power from the panels mean using less mains electricity for much of the year, helping control increasing operating costs.

We are often asked if we can let people have the hall free or at a greatly reduced rate but as a charity we do not receive any funding from the council and survive solely on our hire rental fees for our maintenance and operating costs.

This spring we intend adding a glass veranda to the west wall, enhancing the façade and giving more protection from the elements. It is hoped this will encourage more bookings for larger events.

The veranda has been made possible due to the legacy from **John Light**, which can only be used for major works. John was a member of the hall committee from its inception in 1992, despite multiple health challenges he became the driving force within the committee, working tirelessly as treasurer and much more. John made a major contribution to the building of the hall, notably the design and installation of the electrical and heating systems and the main door entry and locking system. The hall belongs to everyone in the village and we hope that some of you will help to fund raise and think of ways to help keep our hall viable and used. Wheathill Priory Community Transport – WPCT

Our Community Transport Scheme needs extra drivers! Our volunteer driving scheme, by and for the residents of Keinton Mandeville, Kingweston, Lydford and Barton St. David, has proved so successful that we are struggling to keep up with the demand for our services. As a result, we are seeking drivers who could spare a few hours a month to join our team. Drivers are paid 45p per mile (the Government approved mileage rate) for each drive undertaken.

The scheme is available to help out those who do not drive or have their own transport or those for whom public transport (*if it is available*) is difficult to access. It can be used for, but not necessarily restricted to, journeys up to 25 miles each way to: the doctor; hospital (*if free transport is not available*); the post office; shopping; friends or relatives (*including when in hospital*); bus stops; bus stations or railway stations for onward journeys. Requests for journeys should be made *at least 48 hours in advance* **Contact number is: 07799 487719.**

Lydford on Fosse Community SpeedWatch - CSW

The Community SpeedWatch (CSW) team are seeking volunteers to join their active group. All CSW teams operate under the supervision of the Avon and Somerset Police – A&SP. Monitoring involves using a traffic speed gun and recording details of the registration number, make and colour of the speeding vehicle. Details of vehicles are uploaded to the A&SP website and registered keepers receive a letter from A&SP advising them that they have been recorded exceeding the posted speed limit. For registered keepers who exceed the speed limit by a large margin, or who are multiple offenders, they could receive a visit from the Police.

As a member of the team, you would be part of the district-wide organisation consisting of 33 schemes with over 200 volunteers. In the Lydfords we have five approved sites in the village, B3153 Cary Road, East and West of the traffic lights, B3153 Toy Farm, A37 opposite the Motorhome site and A37 Bridgefoot. Depending which members of the team are available the sites are not monitored on regular days or regular times. After training you will be supplied by the A&SP with a hivis jacket (and winter jacket if required), a beanie hat and other equipment such as the speed gun and a digital voice recorder. The training is provided by the Mendip Coordinator and/or a Police Community Support Officer, PCSO.

The CSW team are backed up by the Avon and Somerset Police Speed Enforcement team, who have six camera vans, two of which are unmarked, and six camera motorbikes whose riders are now not restricted with cables attached to their bikes do so they are not always noticeable when monitoring.

The CSW team operate at random times during the daylight hours and in dry weather, and each session lasts for one hour and can be on any day of the week. The more volunteers we have the less often you would be asked to help, now it would be about one hour every two weeks.

Speeding is a big concern in the village. Vehicles have been recorded as travelling at nearly 60mph in both the 30 and 40mph limits. We know from data over many years that the yellow jackets are seen and traffic does slow down, so if you feel you would like to help reduce the incidence of speeding vehicles and have one hour to spare every couple of weeks, your help would be very much welcomed. Alternatively, why not join us at the roadside as an observer to see how it works before committing yourself? Please contact the Parish Clerk using the email – *lofpcclerk@gmail.com*

Completing this activity before 1st March helps to ensure that it does not disturb nesting birds during the breeding season. Please also remove any resulting trimmings to keep the footways clear and tidy for pedestrian use.

Romance Fraud

The information below is taken from the Action Fraud website.

Romance scams involve people being duped into sending money to criminals who go to great lengths to gain their trust and convince them that they are in a genuine relationship. They use language to manipulate, persuade and exploit so that requests for money do not raise alarm bells. These requests might be highly emotive, such as criminals claiming they need money for emergency medical care, or to pay for transport costs to visit the victim if they are overseas. Scammers will often build a relationship with their victims over time.

Signs your friend or family member may be involved in a romance scam:

- They may be very secretive about their relationship or provide excuses for why their online partner has not video called or met them in person. They might become hostile or angry, and withdraw from conversation when you ask any questions about their partner
- They may express very strong emotions and commitment to someone they have only just met
- They have sent, or are planning to send, money to someone they have not met face-to-face. They may take out loans or withdraw from their bank account to send money.

How users can stay safe from romance scams:

- Be suspicious of any requests for money from someone you have never met in person, particularly if you have only recently met online.
- Speak to your family or friends to get advice.
- Profile photos may not be genuine, do your research first. Performing a reverse image on a search engine can find photos that have been taken from somewhere, or someone, else.

It is important that no matter how long you've been speaking to someone online and how much you think you trust them, if you have not met them in person it's important that you do not:

- · Send them any money
- Allow them access to your bank account
- · Transfer money on their behalf
- Take a loan out for them
- Provide copies of your personal documents such as passports or driving licenses
- Invest your own money on their behalf or on their advice
- · Purchase and send the codes on gift cards from Amazon or iTunes
- Agree to receive and/or send parcels on their behalf (laptops, mobile phones etc.)

If you think you have been a victim of a romance scam, do not feel ashamed or embarrassed - you are not alone. Contact your bank immediately and *report it to Action Fraud T: 0300 123 2040 or via actionfraud.police.uk*.

Reflecting God's Love



Someone once asked the great Anglican monastic theologian Herbert Kelly this questions: 'How do we know what the will of God is?' to which he famously answered, 'We don't. That's the joke.' Kelly is right: we can't know precisely what God's will is in a certain situation. But we can open up opportunities for God to 'come through' our actions, and building community is a key way of doing this.

In any situation we can try and tune our lives a bit more to God. And across our diocese our commitment to our communities is key to this.

So, when we meet people, a simple smile shows the person before us we see them as a friend. This is not to suggest ignorance or naivety. We are not unaware of the limitations and imperfections of a person, but we are prepared to focus more deeply, to the depths of the heart in each person. To seek out the goodness that only love and trust can bring to birth.

As a Cistercian writer recently put it:

'Let us welcome each person as Christ, because in all truth it is Christ whom we welcome. 'You did this to me' (Matthew 25). Let us look for the beloved face of Christ in each person, for each is his true face.'

But why start our focus on community, with those around us, and not God? Good question. Perhaps it is best explained by a lovely saying from the Desert Father, John the Dwarf: 'You don't build a house by starting with the roof and working down. You start with the foundation.' They said, 'What does that mean?'

He said, 'The foundation is our neighbour whom we must win. The neighbour is where we start. Every commandment of Christ depends on this.'


