VE and VJ 80

This year marks the 80th anniversary of the ending of the Second World War VE Day in May saw many commemorations across the nation, and a national remembrance lasting for several days.

VJ Day on 15 August is a much more subdued event, nationally there are plans for a service at the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire.

The complexity around **VJ Day** includes the use of atomic bombs at Hiroshima and Nagasaki along with the distance of the war in the Far East from our shores. After **VE day** residents of Europe felt safe and secure, so they celebrated then. But for those whose families were PoW or fighting in the Far East they felt forgotten.

So we remember with many mixed emotions, emotions that come to the fore in our current world, with battles, long distance drones and missiles and ongoing complexity and uncertainty as nations fight to be allowed to hold their land and live. Without doubt there are rights and wrongs in all fighting, and there are those who are trampled underfoot (literally and figuratively) and feel forgotten and overlooked.

We are going to commemorate VJ Day in Barton St David at 11:00am on Friday, 15th August, followed by Tea and Coffee in the Village Hall.

We do, so aware of the Psalm which says:

'The nations are in uproar, the kingdoms totter; He utters his voice, the earth melts. The Lord of hosts is with us, The God of Jacob is our refuge.

Come, behold the works of the Lord: See what desolations he has brought on the earth; He makes wars cease to the end of the earth: He breaks the bow, and shatters the spear; He burns the shields with fire. Be still and know that I am God! I am exalted among the nations I am exalted in the earth. *The Lord of hosts is with us:* The God of Jacob is our refuge" (Psalm 46:6-11)

War is complex, remembering is complex. We are called to remember those who gave their lives so that we might live, those whose lives were and are permanently affected by their military service, those who are still serving in the military, and civilians caught up in the wars in their nations.

As we remember let us look to God who reminds us that he is with us, our refuge and the one who can bring peace even in the midst of war.

With ongoing prayers for peace and hope.

There is no charge as the sessions are funded by KM Parish Council.


The group is open to anyone who would like to come, you don't need to live in Keinton Mandeville.

Wheathill Priory Community Transport - WPCT

We are a volunteer driving service by and for the residents of Keinton Mandeville, Kingweston, Lydford and Barton St David. Due to a kind donation from the Keinton Mandeville Parochial Church Council:

We are again able to offer FREE transport for Covid and Flu vaccination appointments. If you reside in our villages, do not have your own transport and would like us to take and return you from your vaccination appointment, please call our scheme coordinator on **07799 487719** to make arrangements. We will provide free transport to one of the local vaccination centres (within 10 miles) or to your GP. We would like to remind everyone that if you are a resident of our villages, do not drive or have your own transport, or you find public transport (if it is available) difficult to access, you may be eligible to use the scheme.

Our Community Transport Scheme can be used for, but not necessarily restricted to, journeys up to 25 miles each way to:

- the doctor, dentist, hospital (if free transport is not available), post office, shopping
- friends or relatives (including when in hospital)
- · local bus stops, bus stations or railway stations for onward journey

If you would like to use our Community Transport scheme please call us – 48 hours in advance – and we will do what we can to help: **Contact**: **07799 487719**.

We are always interested in drivers who can spare a few hours a month to join our team. Drivers are paid 45p per mile (the Government approved mileage rate) for each drive undertaken. If you would like to help, please call our coordinator on the above number.

The Parish Council usually meets on the 2nd Wednesday of the month in Lydford Parish Hall at 7:00pm. The next Parish Council meeting will be held on *Wednesday*, 9th July at 7:00pm. Please note there is no meeting in August.

Parish Councillor Vacancy – There is currently a vacancy for a Parish Councillor. If you would like to join our energetic and proactive Parish Council to help resolve short and long term issues for our community - such as flood risk reduction or shaping the local development plan for the Parish for the next 20+ years - please contact the Clerk for more information.

The future of the Playground – As many parishioners will know, the playground is located on the Sports Ground in West Lydford. It is now quite old and, although inspected annually by the Royal Society for the Prevention of Accidents (*RoSPA*) to make sure it is safe, it is obvious the current equipment is reaching the end of its life. Also, the current provision is designed for use by smaller children.

Anticipating the need to remove/replace the current equipment in the next few years, the Parish Council is keen to get the views of interested Parishioners on how we should proceed. E.G. do you feel that we should be bold and offer a wider range of facilities suited to a broader age range; should we replace the current equipment like-for-like; or should the current playground be removed and not replaced.

The Parish Council will be looking for opportunities to canvas parishioners' opinions about the Playground's future over the next 3-4 months. To share your feelings or suggestions on the future of the playground, please email to jim.frampton@lydfordonfosseparish.gov.uk with the subject: 'Playground'.

Flood Response Planning – Lydford on Fosse residents have experienced unanticipated flooding on 3 occasions in the last 18 months; the Met Office have advised that due to Climate Change, incidents of very localised, very heavy rain are likely to become more common in the future. The Parish Council has therefore formed **A Flood Risk Management Working Group (FRM WG)** to improve our options for managing the risk of flooding locally. The Working Group has identified a 4-step approach which it is now starting to work through:

- 1. Develop an **'Emergency Response Plan'** outlining the steps that we can take as a community to quickly respond to the risk of flooding, and to reduce the damage done by any damage that does occur.
- 2. Acquire equipment that can help the Parish to respond when flood risk rises.
- 3. Establish a means of regularly monitoring and, if necessary, clearing blocked parts of the Parish's drainage network, such as drains, gullies, ditches and rhynes.
- 4. Working with landowners/public bodies to find long term opportunities to reduce the risk of flooding, such as encouraging farming methods that avoid soil compaction which can contribute to flash flooding through surface water run-off.

An important element of **the Flood Emergency Response Plan** will be an annex to identify who in the Parish is willing to assist and/or to lend equipment in the event of flooding or a major flood risk being identified. The FRM WG is therefore keen to hear from you if you would be available to assist in the event of a heightened flood risk and/or you would be prepared to lend the following items:

- Portable water pumps
- Generators
- Tractors (to allow movement through deep water, we will assume that tractors will come with designated drivers unless told otherwise)
- Hay bales (to create barriers to divert flood waters)
- Plastic Sheeting (to create barriers/dams to withhold/divert flood waters)
- Spare timber (to secure barriers/dams)

This list is not exhaustive, if you have other items that you think may be useful and are willing to make them available, please get in touch. Be assured that you are not committing yourself by offering to help – we understand that circumstances may prevent this on the day. But having a list of who to ask straight away, we will save valuable time even if not everyone can.

Lydford and District Gardening Club

A very long time ago, back in the days 'when Noah was a lad', a pedagogical paragon declaimed some very useful words of great wisdom

'When writing an essay', he said, 'start with an introduction which sets out what you are going to say in your piece of work. In the main part of the essay you should then say what you want to say and finally, in the conclusion, you should then say what you have said.'

This three part recipe for academic writing appeared to provide a vital frame-work for all subjects and it did good service on many topics as varied as 'The causes of the First World War', 'The importance of 'The Frontier' in defining the character of the modern United States of America' and 'Describe the main features of a glaciated upland landscape'.

It is plausible to suggest that a similar approach should be adopted when preparing to make a speech to a group of keen horticulturists. Tell the assembled green-fingered people what they are going to hear; give them about one hour's worth of information, tips and advice and then spend a few minutes in recapping what has just been said! This structure might be a bit too staid and formulaic for some people's tastes but by and large it would tick quite a few boxes and the lanes of Somerset would be filled with satisfied and informed people, wending their way home from the Brue-side, Parish Hall venue and reflecting on what they had just heard.

Mickey Little has no such truck with archaic ideas of form. He obviously never had a strict, Welsh history teacher or if he did, then he has spent his whole life trying to ignore the dictates of such a martinet and break free from the restrictions suggested by any Celtic tyrant.

On June 10th his topic was roses and his audience was the Lydford and District Gardening Club. The Parish Hall was packed and the door was open to allow some of the perfect summer's evening to come inside. Mr. Little's approach was based on the scattershot formula and it provided an entertaining and informative evening as members enjoyed a few, brief hours away from the pressures of maintaining their plots. The talk contained history, literature, planting advice, pruning advice and lots more. Who knew that the thorns on a rose stem are essentially devices to allow the plants to climb? Many photographs were shown to provide evidence as to the effectiveness of this adaptation and inspired planting of ramblers and climbers may soon occur throughout the local area.

Pruning was de-mystified and outward-facing buds, or their absence, no longer have such a large role in the nightmares of otherwise calm and content members of society. The largest intake of breath came when he suggested that it was reasonable to spend £90 on a pair of secateurs! For that much money most members would expect the articles to be gold-plated and to come with a lifetime membership of the R.H.S!

On Tuesday July 8th the Club will reconvene in the minutes leading up to 19:00hrs and the speaker will be Sally Nex. She has been before and was very entertaining, extremely informative and quite structured. Her topic will be along the lines of what to do with any glut of gardening produce.

Perhaps her talk might also include a few ideas on how such excesses can be avoided. Successional sowing is often talked about in this context but is quite a tricky thing to master, especially when some seeds fail to germinate at all and the term 'sparingly', when used to refer to the density of dropping the little things, is impossible to define on any accurate basis.

And then we come to August – This is the month when almost all the population of the Lydfords, Keinton Mandeville and Barton St. David go to their yachts moored in the more salubrious areas of the Mediterranean. Why bother planning a gathering when it would interrupt a lot of relaxed cruising along the remote coastlines of the Balearics? *Consequently there is no meeting in August.*

Lydford Third Tuesday Group

May: We enjoyed a talk by Laura Batt (ably assisted by her husband John) on the subject of "Hedgehog Awareness". Laura has been a volunteer for many years at Prickles Hedgehog Rescue in Cheddar, a charity that rescues injured, underweight and orphaned hedgehogs

The animals are fed, treated, rehabilitated and then released to a safe environment. Laura and John are both passionate about the welfare and survival of hedgehogs and, over the years, have raised £14000 for various hedgehog charities.

Laura explained that hedgehog numbers in the UK have fallen dramatically from about 30 million in the 1950's to about 1 million today. They are now on the "red list" of threatened species (published by the International Union for Conservation of Nature). Reasons for their decline include loss of habitat due to changing farming practices, use of pesticides and poisons, busier roads and expansion of land for housing.

Laura's talk was full of good advice that we can all follow to help their survival e.g. checking garages and sheds to avoid shutting a hedgehog in; checking bonfires before lighting them; providing escape routes from ponds; making a small hole in fences to create a 'hedgehog highway' between gardens; using slug pellets sparingly (or not at all); taking care when strimming, mowing and turning over compost heaps.

The message that Laura and John wanted us to take away was that these simple measures only take 5 minutes of our time, but can mean life not death for a hedgehog!

Beware of phishing texts and emails

Fraud Protect Officers from Avon and Somerset Police want to make people aware of phishing texts and emails. Fraudsters can pretend to be anyone over text or email, and they are often influenced by current affairs, such as Covid and the cost of living crisis.

Here are some text message examples below where we have removed the links, but these could also come through via email.

Amazon – We detected a login from a new device on 16/06/2025 at 10:15am If this wasn't you please follow the link

Royal Mail – Your package is waiting for delivery. Please confirm settlement of £1.99 on the following link

When the victim follows the link, they will be asked for personal details such as bank/card information and passwords.

However, just clicking on the link alone can result in malicious spyware or viruses being downloaded onto the victim's device.

Unfortunately, there is often a secondary part to these phishing texts, which is particularly sophisticated –

It is known as "transfer into a safe account" fraud. The victim, maybe even a few days later, might be contacted by a fraudster, purporting to be from their bank. The fraudster will know who they bank with, along with other personal details, from the information harvested from the phishing text. They will claim that there has been fraud on their account and their funds are at risk, often referring to the phishing text.

The victim, remembering the recent phishing text, is often convinced by the fraudster, feeling panicked by the thought of their funds being at risk. The fraudster explains that, to protect their funds, they need to transfer them into a "safe account". **The bank details provided simply belong to the fraudster.**

Remember: -

- Stop and think before responding to any email or text message
- Don't click on links unless you can verify where they came from
- Never provide information to anyone who contacts you out of the blue take time to verify their credentials through a trusted source
- Just because a text or email purports to be from a government agency or organisation doesn't mean it is
- Forward scam text messages to 7726 (SPAM) and emails to report@phishing.gov.uk



Listening to Young People

Later this month I shall be joining young people from around our diocese on a visit to the Taizé community in France.

Taizé offers the opportunity to take a step back from daily life, meet people from around the world, join in a week of prayer, worship and Bible teaching, and reflect on our life of faith. In churches we often speak about God. To visit Taizé is to have a big encounter with God.

This will be the third time I have helped lead a Bath and Wells group on this pilgrimage. Some of our young people will be making a return visit, others attending for the first time. I am looking forward to seeing all they gain from the experience and to simply spending time listening to them and all they have to

The opportunity to spend an extended time listening to young people is an utter privilege. While more young people are showing an interest in faith, the Church of England is undeniably still dominated by the older generations. Whenever I can, I value immensely the chance to listen to young people – of their hopes and dreams, their fears and perspectives, their insights and understanding. Such listening is essential if young people are to be fully part of the life of our Church. It's vital if we are to continue to see the shoots of growth that are happening across our diocese and the wider church.

We're pursuing this challenge of listening to young people in lots of different ways. It doesn't just happen at Taizé! Our Young Leaders Hub is one arena. Elsewhere we are looking at how young people can play their full part within the life of our diocesan decision-making bodies and in the national church too. I urge you to do the same where you are.

'Nothing about us without us' is a challenge that's sometimes extended when discussing how young people can participate fully wherever they find themselves. What an aim and a prize this would be for us all to pursue.




