What does God do when I pray?

I suspect that most of us are finding the current stalemate in the situation in Gaza and Ukraine (the peace talks are just happening as I write) challenging, and they may cause you to wonder how there can be a God when 'nothing appears to be happening and so many people are suffering'. I admit to admitting that I struggle with this too, and to not having a complete answer.

However, something that I have found useful is a book written in 2015 by the Rev'd Dr David Wilkinson, a scientist and theologian, *'When I pray what does God do?'* which looks at this topic, particularly science and faith (the subject of this year's holiday club!)

Sometimes we think of prayer purely as asking God to intervene in a situation, be it an international one or a local one and we're frustrated when the answer isn't:

- a) immediate
- b) what we were looking for.

Maybe in these circumstance the first thing to ask ourselves is do we know the God to whom we are praying, and do we thank him when things go right? Do we stop and admire the wonder of the world around us and thank for that? Do we admit to our own mistakes and wrongdoing? When we do that, we become more aware of who God is, and maybe more willing to watch and wait for his answer.

Another part of this challenge is our humanity. Most of us can probably think of something for which we've needed to apologise in the past few days. I'm constantly failing to do things I should have done and doing things that I should not have done. God is not a God who 'forces' himself into our lives. We have freedom and free will, which means that we can refuse to follow his love and call and do our own thing, go our own way. If that is true for us as individuals it is also true for nations and leaders of nations. Peace needs to come because people want it, not as a requirement, because that will not be a lasting peace.

Sometimes we don't recognise the answers, they may be yes, or no, or not yet, and as we continue to pray we recognise what it is that we're looking for. When we're praying for international situations sometimes all we can do is to ask that the God of Love would intervene, to bring relief, peace, hope and life. We may not see the answers but who knows what will happen in the lives of individuals caught up in war or natural disaster.

It is a challenge, and challenging to keep on going and keep on praying in these situations. But maybe if we get to know God better and move away from a *'slot machine'* image, whereby we put prayer in and out comes the answer we want, then we can become more able to live with the contradictions and challenges and to walk with Him into the complex world in which we live.

Due to a kind donation from the Keinton Mandeville Parochial Church Council: We are again able to offer FREE transport for Covid and Flu vaccination appointments. If you reside in our villages, do not have your own transport and would like us to take and return you from your vaccination appointment, please call our scheme coordinator on 07799 487719 to make arrangements. We will provide free transport to one of the local vaccination centres (within 10 miles) or to your GP. We would like to remind everyone that if you are a resident of our villages, do not drive or have your own transport, or you find public transport (if it is available) difficult to access, you may be eligible to use the scheme.

Our Community Transport Scheme can be used for, but not necessarily restricted to, journeys up to 25 miles each way to:

- the doctor, dentist, hospital (if free transport is not available), post office, shopping
- friends or relatives (including when in hospital)
- local bus stops, bus stations or railway stations for onward journey

Barton St David Scout Group

We are enjoying our holidays after hugely successful summer term, looking forward to starting back in September. Sometimes we think summer is the best Scouting term but the Barton St David sessions inside a lovely cosy village hall (thanks to Barton St David Village Hall Committee) are equally successful,

challenging and fun. Quieter sessions indoors help youngsters to socialise more, make friends from different villages and schools and simply keep on acquiring those skills for life that are just as important as an adult as other more formal qualifications. Evidence shows that Scouting helps children/young adults reach their full potential. The Scout programme specifically focuses on teamwork; time management; leadership; initiative; planning; communication; self-motivation; awareness and commitment. What job application doesn't require all of these skills? We know that we help young people to get jobs, save lives and even change the world (or at least their bit of it anyway!).

But unless we keep our young people from ages 6 to 18 then all of the above is wasted. We have amazing retention through all sections which means that when you look at our 14-18 year olds that we first met when they were 6 years old, you can't help but be so impressed with their mature and friendly characters, their resilience and their immense determination. We retain our youngsters by ensuring we are modern and thriving and then we make our programme fun and varied. In the summer term we have done caving; kayaking; bouldering; archery; beekeeping (we have honey for sale); first aid; sailing; science experiments; debating; camps; London Monopoly Run; bike maintenance; making tie-die tshirts and sausage making. If you'd like your child to have this type of experience then please ask to join us.

I find it one of the most joyful and rewarding things to watch youngsters developing until they are almost unrecognisable even after two years of Scouting.

Those who join as adult have just as much fun. Some of us are fully up for the most challenging activities and a few of us are less willing to push our comfort zones as far as the youngsters! Both types of adults still have a brilliant social experience and lots of fun. Lydford on Fosse Parish Hall update

The Parish Hall Management Committee would like to advise Parish Hall users about some changes that we have made to the way the use of the Parish Hall is funded. You may be familiar with the coin-operated heating system that we have used to heat the hall for many years, and you may know it was unpopular because of the increasing difficulty of sourcing cash in this contactless age.

So, we recently upgraded the system and removed the coin operated system. Hall users can now simply press a timer switch for heating for a set duration; no direct payment is necessary. As we still need to recover the costs of heating the hall, we have modestly increased the hire rates.

These are now:

- Parish Residents: £10 per hr. (6+ sessions: £9 per hr).
- Non-Parish Residents: £11 per hr. (6+ sessions: £10.50 per hr).

Use of the Hob/Ovens – The committee also agreed that if the hob or ovens are used, a flat fee of £3 per session will be applied to help cover the associated energy costs. After holding all our rates steady for many years in the face of rising energy costs, we hope you will understand the need to make these small adjustments to cover our costs.

We also hope that you will agree that these are still very attractive prices, and whether you come to the Parish Hall for one (or more) of the many clubs or groups that uses it, or are looking for a one-off location for an intimate wedding reception, a birthday party or just a sociable gathering of friends and family, you will bear the Parish Hall in mind!

Lydford and District Gardening Club

In a marked and dramatic change from the normal form of these reports, the order for September is being reversed. Usually, for those who need reminding, several paragraphs of gibberish are followed by

vital Club information relating to the performance of the most recent speaker, the identity of the next victim to head into the horticultural 'Lion's Den' that is Lydford Parish Hall and any special details about free plants, supplies of horse manure or similar bounty. It is this second section that is put on the Club website and everyone should now, immediately, stop reading and go on to <code>www.Lydfordanddistrictgardeinginclub.co.uk</code> and check to ensure that this is indeed the situation.

Whilst on the site it should be explored in its entirety with special emphasis on the stunning photographs which are available and many other useful pages. The weather section even includes a daily forecast which gives the temperature in Fahrenheit and this obviously removes the stress of remembering the formula - X 9/5 then + 32 - normally required to turn Celsius into common sense! However, the normal order of things is being reversed. For those of a mathematical bent, B.O.D.M.A.S or B.I.D.M.A.S. is suddenly becoming S.A.M.D.O.B or S.A.M.D.I.B (*P.E.M.D.A.S. apparently in the U.S.A. for those who really do have too much time on their hands!*). And the reason for this departure is simply to do with the vast amount of information which needs to be relayed, especially after a month off and the annual fortnight spent 'clubbing' in Ibiza.

Previous Meeting

At the last meeting of the Club, held so many weeks ago at the beginning of July, the speaker was Sally Nex and she has 'form' for being an enthusiast. Life is busy and even putting a label on pots can often prove to be just too much of an effort. When, despite best efforts to the contrary a glut has appeared, effective ways of storing the produce would probably be familiar to our forbears who lived through World War II. Jams, pickles, cordials, bottling and freezing were all discussed and useful tips given. Thankfully, salting was not mentioned. Salted runner beans were truly disgusting yet were still produced with great pride for Sunday lunch in February. On the topic of bottling - many people use 'Kilner' jars. Few people know that this product was created by Mr. John Kilner in 1842 at his factory near Dewsbury in Yorkshire. Even fewer are aware that Mr. Kilner is Jeremy Clarkson's several times great grandfather! Ms. Nex was good and enthused her audience.

Next Meeting - Barbecue

On Tuesday, 9th September, the Club meeting will take the form of a barbecue. Members should gather at the Parish Hall around 18:00hrs – *please note the unusual time but we will be in Autumn by then and nights will be drawing in* – and sausages will abound. Also, the meeting will provide people with the chance to swap any surplus produce they may have, whether it has been turned into jam or not, and offer any spare seedlings or divisions that have survived the drought. So do not come empty handed! As is now traditional, the raffle for this month will be especially sumptuous. Indeed it will be an event in its own right!

So, whilst there will be no charge for the food and drink on offer, if members could search down the back of settees or under car seats and find a few coins or even a small note to spend on the raffle, this would be greatly appreciated.



Generosity begets generosity Living the story. Telling the story

In August I was privileged to dedicate the restored clock in the tower of Montacute church. It's not just any old clock. In fact, Montacute's is amongst the oldest in the country.

Built in the village in around 1400, the clock is so old that it is held in place by iron wedges. At the time of its construction, the nut and the bolt wouldn't be invented for another hundred years!

The Montacute clock is an artefact that seems to generate generosity. In the 1980s the clock was restored by Humphrey Hamlin, for whom it is now named. Humphrey poured time and energy into its mechanism, preventing it from being scrapped. During the last two years, heroic efforts by the people of Montacute have led to its further restoration. All this was marked last month by a whole village gathering. The community choir sang, morris men danced, the local pub provided a hog roast, cake was dispensed in huge quantities.

Montacute is a beautiful example of how generosity begets generosity. Like a chain reaction, one act of generosity, the restoration of the clock, led to another, another and another. As a result, a whole community was brought together in celebration and joy.

In his second letter to the Church in Corinth, Paul writes of the church in Macedonia that 'their abundant joy and their extreme poverty have overflowed in a wealth of generosity' (2 Cor 8:2). Having nothing, the Macedonians discovered that they could still give. In turn, their generosity enabled Paul to challenge and encourage the church in Corinth to do the same. All to help the struggling Church in Ierusalem.

As I travel around our diocese, I see this pattern of generosity begetting generosity happening in so many places. One person starts, another adds their contribution, more join in and soon we learn that together we are so much more than the sum of our parts. This is the economy of God. It's an economy that all of us are invited to join.


