Do you like the smell/taste of fresh bread?

We have a bread maker, and I love coming back into the house when it has almost finished it's cycle. In recent years there's been a growth in interest about our bread.

Remember the flurry of Sourdough aficionados during COVID? Or the questions raised about additives that make something that doesn't keep last?

In some ways it's simple, yeast, flour, water, salt, sugar, oil. In other ways it's complex, the wrong ratios leads to a brick. Not enough kneading makes for a tough dough with under developed gluten. Then there is the question of adequate proving for the right textures. In fact much of the process is ensuring the best rise possible.

Whether we eat it or not bread is often seen as one of the foundation foods, world over. It may look different in different cultures and contexts, but in the prayer Jesus taught us we pray:

Give us this day our daily bread (or in some translations our daily sustenance)

He also called himself the bread of life, implying that just as bread is a basic sustenance for many across the world so we're called to depend upon him day by day.

So as we come to harvest we do so thanking God for all that he gives us. For many farmers here and across the world we are in uncertain times, low yields and increasing costs and uncertainty. Maybe in these times praying 'give us our daily bread' reminds us to depend upon God, and to thank him.



Keinton Environment Group (KEG)

Our recent talks on Keinton's Quarrying heritage and the Agronomics of farming in our local area were very well attended and were thoroughly enjoyed by all who were able to attend. We are planning on more talks in the future – although dates and details have yet to be confirmed, the topics might include the *work of Somerset Climate Action, the importance of Bees and Wild Gardening.*

The aim of these events is for KEG to raise funds for environmental projects around the village. Currently, we have plans to undertake maintenance on the Community Copse and local hedgerows, as well as extending our wildflower planting scheme.

There are a couple of schemes village residents could take part in; we will relaunch our "Adopt a Tree" scheme for the Community Copse at the end of October, and we are always keen to hear of anyone who has an area of garden or verge in which they'd like to plant pollinator-friendly wild flowers. As part of this scheme, we are aiming to produce wildflower plug plants (which we've found grow more successfully than seeds) which we will give away sometime towards the end of winter in 2026.

Traffic Survey and Next Steps

After consultation with the village the parish council has now commissioned Highways from Somerset Council to put in place the 20mph speed limit in parts of the village.

Planning application 22/01720/OUT

Hopefully everyone in the village will be aware of the application that was objected to by many in the village, the parish council and SHOCK. The application went before the South Somerset Area South Planning Committee and was approved but the parish council and SHOCK believe there are potentially areas of practice and law whereby this decision can be challenged. The route is to instigate a judicial review but there are many steps to go through before a court hearing can take place. Currently there has been a Pre Pre Action letter submitted to Somerset Council and the parish council and SHOCK are awaiting a response. Minutes from parish council and public meetings are available on the parish council website or by requesting from the clerk.

After a very busy month in September we are having a quieter month in October. The results of our fund raising events, *Harvest Supper on the* 19^{th} *September and Gift Week from the* 22^{nd} *September* will be in the November magazine. Although I can report that the **Shanty Night** held to raise funds towards church benefice funds and The Cornwall Air Ambulance raised £1852.00.

House Communion

Lydford Church Car Park

The first stage of the improvement work to the car park is now completed, and the small committee that bought this project together would like to acknowledge their thanks to all those who contributed to raising the funds for the work.

Altogether £8,500 was raised with the St Peters PCC making up the shortfall from the actual cost if required.

We would like to thank Matt Williams from Brimble Lea Planning Consultancy based in Gillingham, Dorset who managed the project planning application and its implications. Our thanks also go to Jonnie Long of West Lydford who, as contractor, has done an amazing job for us.

We received two large grants, **one of £1,000** from a local charity who wishes to remain anonymous **and one of £2,500** from Somerset Community Fund. Other large contributions were received from Lydford on Fosse Parish Council, Royal Enfield Club, Lydford Parish Hall, St Peters PCC Gift Week, a Village Shed Sale, and the car park QR code. The remainder being made up of generous gifts and Grid Sponsorship.

This work has made the car park much more user friendly and we trust that it also helps protect the War Memorial from further damage by vehicles.

We would like to thank you all very much.

In time the car park will require resurfacing, so all those who do use the car park please do make donations towards its upkeep via the QR Code in the car park or by making donations to St Peters PCC marking it for the car park fund.

Lydford on Fosse Parish Council

The Parish Council (PC) met on 10^{th} September; the following matters were discussed:

- A member of the public raised their concern about the spread of Himalayan Balsam, an invasive species, along the banks of the River Brue, contributing to the erosion of the river banks, and of the build-up of sedge in the water, impeding the flow of the river and creating a risk to wildlife. The PC will seek further advice from the Environment Agency and Somerset Council's Environment Department on the best way to tackle these issues.
- The PC still has a vacancy for a councillor and are keen to hear from anyone who might be interested in volunteering for the position.
- A planning application for a new dwelling on the High Street, West Lydford, was considered. Due to its location outside the West Lydford Development Area and its very close proximity to a neighbouring residence, Councillors agreed to recommend that Somerset Council reject the application.
- A site for a new Dog Waste Bin has been identified in East Lydford on the finger post at the top of Church Lane by the stile. It is hoped that this will reverse the growing nuisance caused by inconsiderate dog walkers.
- An ambitious plan to replace the current playground on the Sports Ground was presented, and the first steps to delivering it were outlined as seeking funding and seeing if there is support for such a project in the Parish.

The next Parish Council meeting will take place on Wednesday, 8th October, in the Parish Hall, starting at 7:00pm. Members of the public are very welcome to attend and participate.

Lydford and District Gardening Club



Before any generalisations are made about anything to do with the weather, the caveat has to be issued that things are not necessarily as predictable as they once were! As some of you may have noticed, this

summer has been quite dry and warm. Unusually so. However, September has been fairly damp and quixotic – not really the 'Indian Summer' that we hope for nor the 'season of mists and mellow fruitfulness' made famous by the poet John Keats. However, he was writing in 1820, over 200 years ago and things have probably changed quite a lot since then, the price of a pint of beer has certainly increased by several farthings! But generalisations are cosy and comforting and anchor our existence with a sense of familiarity and understanding. So it is possible to think of October as a 'good' month. It is not as dreary and depressing as January, with apologies to those who think the first month of the year is exciting and full of new beginnings. Smoke Alarms

Check the batteries in your smoke alarm and replace if necessary.

Carbon Monoxide Detector

- If you live in a house that's entirely powered by electricity, you won't need a
 carbon monoxide detector. But if you have a fuel (gas, LPG, oil, wood) burning
 boiler, fire or stove, you should have one in every room where the fuel is
 burned.
- Check the date on your carbon monoxide (CO) detector. Replace any CO detector older than five years.
- You can't see, smell or taste carbon monoxide so you need to be able to recognise the symptoms of carbon monoxide poisoning – headache, breathlessness, confusion, dizziness, nausea and fatigue – it can feel like a dose of the flu!

For or against: slavery and salvation

Much of our world operates around the challenge to be 'for' or 'against'. And generally, it is easier to be against things than for them! Look at the tendencies of the media, politics and religious disputes.

On October 18th, Anti-Slavery Day, people across the UK will recommit themselves to the fight against modern slavery and human trafficking, one of the great evils of our time.

Like William Wilberforce and what we now call historic slavery, we need to fight against the oppression and exploitation of our sisters and brothers today. Abolition is the proper aim of being anti or against.

And the challenge is growing with:

- More vulnerable people susceptible to false promises
- Increasingly flexible working arrangements which gives space for criminal agencies to provide goods and services based on exploitation and slave labour
- · Police and prevention resources being ever overstretched
- And our own insatiable appetite for cheap products

There is much we need to learn to oppose and abolish.

But, in facing these almost overwhelming challenges we must not neglect what is primary for our Christian witness, the call to notice, reach out, rescue and restore. The call to love, to be for those who are hidden, neglected, hurting and ignored.

In Anti-Slavery Week, give time to thinking how you or your church or home group could better learn how to contribute to the fight against modern slavery. The Clewer Initiative has some amazing resources to help us open our eyes and assist the authorities and reach out towards victims.

But, alongside these prayers and practices, consider how you could go the extra mile in the way of the Good Samaritan. Going beyond the indifference of the priest and the Levite, too busy to stop, notice, reach out, rescue; rather how can we better contribute to establishing systems like the partnership between the Good Samaritan and the innkeeper– systems to provide care and the basis of restoring proper health and opportunities to those whose cries represent the voice of Jesus for those willing to listen.

Be against modern slavery this October, but more, be for those who need our friendship and our partnership.
