'The Story of Emily'

On holiday in October, I was fortunate to be able to visit *'The Story of Emily'* about the work of Emily Hobhouse, the daughter of a Cornish Vicar. He had grown up at Hadspen House, but spent all his ministerial live in St Ive in Cornwall (near Liskard)

After the death of her father Emily became involved in campaigning for humanitarian and welfare causes, most famously the treatment of women and children in British run concentration camps during the second Boer War at the beginning of the Twentieth Century.

Like I suspect many others I had very little knowledge of how the British had acted during that war, of the Scorched Earth Policy and how people were treated in the camps created to house women and children. Thousands died, more in the black camps than the white ones and the treatment people received was not designed to help them live or the land recover from war. Emily Hobhouse campaigned for this to change, when eventually a report was produced, she was given no recognition by the British Parliament for the work that she had done, both in South Africa and in the UK.

It made me think about how we view history and war. I grew up knowing about concentration camps run by others, but not those run by the British. I know that these were different from the WWII camps, but it is still, to my mind at least, a shameful episode in this nation's history.

The other response that I had was to Emily's motivation. She grew up in a Vicarage, no doubt weekly worship was a part of her life, at least while she lived with her father.

The exhibition tells us nothing of a faith motivation in adult life, but I read Jesus reminder in Matthew's Gospel:

13 You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot.

14 You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hidden.15 No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. ¹16 In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven'. (Matthew 5:12-16)

I wonder how I respond today to the inequalities that I see, to the ongoing effect of war and violence that causes people to have to flee their own land and those who need others to speak up on their behalf?

I wonder too if I live as Salt and Light in the world and community around? I wonder what questions Emily's life raises for you?

This month we remember those who gave their lives in war, but maybe too we can remember those whose lives were, and still are, affected by the treatment they receive at the hands of others and respond with compassion towards them, as we live as salt and light in our communities.

Our recent talk by Adam North on the Agronomics of farming in our local area was thoroughly enjoyed by all who were able to attend – and there may be a repeat performance for those who couldn't make it.

We are planning on more talks in the future – *although dates and details have yet to be confirmed,* the topics might include the work of Somerset Climate Action, the importance of Bees, Wild Gardening and the importance of dark skies.

If you have any expertise on an environmentally – related topic (or know someone else who has) do let us know; we are always on the look-out for new speakers.

The aim of these events is for KEG to raise funds for environmental projects around the village. Currently, we have plans to undertake maintenance on the Community Copse and local hedgerows, as well as extending our wildflower planting scheme.

Residents participation

There are a couple of schemes village residents could take part in; we will relaunch our "Adopt a Tree" scheme for the Community Copse at the end of October, and we are always keen to hear of anyone who has an area of garden or verge in which they'd like to plant pollinator-friendly wild flowers. As part of this scheme, we are aiming to produce wildflower plug plants (which we've found grow more successfully than seeds) which we will give away sometime towards the end of winter in 2026.

Lydford and District Gardening Club



The flowers surrounding the War Memorial in the car park for the Church and Parish Hall down by the Brue in West Lydford are still going strong. Just about. They have done remarkably well over the

summer, especially considering the relative lack of soil in their planting area and the hot and dry conditions which have prevailed for most of the time since they were installed.

Their success has been due in large part to the efforts of the small group of people who have nurtured them over the past months. 'Thanks' cannot be drunk or eaten or placed in a trophy cabinet. They cannot be worn as a badge or traded on a market like some unsophisticated virtual commodity. Thus they may not be tangible but they can be genuine and heartfelt and consequently huge thanks are due to those who have made a great effort this summer to make things a little brighter and better for others. *Naomi, Juliette and Mark, Sally, Ralph, Dave and Lizzie, Lynne and Neil and Pippa* you have been brilliant and next time you catch me in the Cross Keys with that rarest of creatures, an unlocked wallet, a small half will be yours for the asking.

The varieties of flowers which have featured on centre stage down by the river have been stocks, snapdragons, geraniums and small flowered bedding begonias. The latter have been amazingly floriferous, both around the Memorial and in the trough outside the Church door. They may not be many people's favourite flower but they have done an excellent job and fully earned their place in this year's hall of fame.

Rather like the Stoke City side between the years 2008 and 2018, largely under the direction of the revered Tony Pulis, small begonias might not be the prettiest plant in the garden but in terms of effect and achievement they rank very highly indeed! The stocks shone brightly and briefly and the geraniums and snapdragons have been stalwarts through the second half of the season adding a little pleasure to all who saw them.

Should they be scrubbed out whilst flowering and cast aside for new but less impressive varieties. A similar situation occurred in North Staffordshire and Mr. Pulis was replaced by Mark Hughes. Premiership status was retained for a few years but the magic had dimmed a little. The next lot of bedding has a hard act to follow!

October Meeting

Carole Edwards was poorly and could not attend her appointment as the speaker at the October meeting of the Gardening Club. There ought to be a support group for organisation secretaries throughout the world who are tasked with arranging substitutes for speakers who are unable to fulfil their commitments. Stress may be an overused word these days but trying to find alternatives at short notice is not easy. A helpline offering soothing music and lots of suitable phone numbers would make life much more bearable. However, even without such a comfort a replacement was found and Sam Wadey informed and entertained by talking about and displaying succulents.

These background members of the plant world rarely take centre stage yet appeared quite fascinating. Rather like a defensive midfield player tasked with protecting the back four, they are not in any way obvious yet definitely worthy of a mention. If you are lucky enough to access *'The Newt'* at any time, pay more attention to the plants in the greenhouse with the fish and papyrus. Some, if not most of them will be succulents.



As autumn settles in and the nights grow longer, there is often a rise in burglaries. We need to remain vigilant as we turn our clocks back and acknowledge the heightened vulnerability of our homes.



- When you settle down for the evening to watch TV make sure that your doors and windows are locked.
- Don't advertise your absence from home on social media.
- Keep your car keys out of sight and in a secure place. Avoid leaving spare keys in obvious hiding places.
- Secure outbuildings such as sheds and garages with sturdy locks and check regularly.
- Keep curtains and blinds closed in the evenings to prevent visibility into your home. Use timers to turn on lights or radios to create the illusion of someone being at home. You can even wave and call goodbye to the empty house to make it look as if there's someone left at home!
- Make a list of emergency contacts just in case something does happen family contact details, plumber, locksmith, electrician, glazier etc.

Helpful tips if there is a power cut due to severe weather! Who knows what the winter has in store for us so think ahead!

- It doesn't matter who you buy your electricity from anyone can call 105 for free and you will be connected to your local network operator for up to date information
- Leave a light switched on so you know when the power returns
- Limit the use of your smart phone, tablet or laptop to save the battery power
- Avoid opening your freezer door
- Turn off and unplug any sensitive equipment such as TV's and computers, protect such equipment with surge protection plugs
- Unplug appliances that get hot you may forget they are on when the power returns
- Keep battery/wind up torches at the ready
- Many modern telephones won't work during a power cut so use an analogue phone that can be plugged into a telephone socket
- Make sure you have a charged battery charger handy so you can recharge your smart phone or tablet
- · Check on elderly and vulnerable neighbours
- When power cuts are threatened fill a flask with hot water so you can make a drink or fill a hot water bottle.

Lets walk into the Light

A story that's often told in our churches comes from the fourth chapter of John's Gospel. It tells of Jesus, in the blinding heat of midday meeting a Samaritan woman at the well in a town called Sychar.

The woman is hoisting up heavy buckets of water in the hot sun. She's there because she's a woman with 'a reputation' and it's the only time of day she can avoid the muttering of her neighbours who meet at the well at cooler hours.

In an extraordinary encounter, Jesus sees deep into the woman's heart. Through their conversation Jesus brings about her healing and restoration into the community from which she is estranged. It's a story of life, possibility, new beginnings and forgiveness.

The woman at the well is not the only Biblical story set in Sychar. There's another, contained in the 34^{th} chapter of the Book of Genesis. This is a tale of terror that's never heard in our churches; the rape of a girl called Dinah. It's a dark, nasty tale of violence that wrecks the life of individuals, families and the entire community. So we don't speak about it. We keep it hidden.

Sometimes people say to me of safeguarding 'It's just a tick box exercise', an onerous compliance requirement. Rather I would say that our work in safeguarding asks fundamental questions about the kind of places we want our churches to be. Just like the Bible passages I've mentioned, we can be places of hiddenness, silence, and hurt. Or places of life, new beginnings and restoration.

Accounts like the Makin review have shone light on our story. We've also been working hard to bring about change. While we cannot be complacent, I am intensely proud of all that was revealed about safeguarding in Bath and Wells by our independent audit that happened earlier this year. This told us that we are moving towards a much better story. So let's build on the momentum we have created. Let's walk into the light


