

#### **Keinton Environment Group (KEG)**

We are planning on more talks in the future – *although dates and details have yet to be confirmed,* the topics might include the work of Somerset Climate Action; Bees (*both wild and "domesticated"*); Wild Gardening; the importance of dark skies; the work of Somerset Ornithology Group and the health benefits of nature and the environment. If you have any expertise on an environmentally-related topic (or know someone else who has) do let us know; we are always on the look-out for new speakers.

The aim of these events is for KEG to raise funds for environmental projects around the village. Currently, we have plans to undertake maintenance on the Community Copse and local hedgerows, as well as extending our wildflower planting scheme. We would also love to get the community involved in promoting boxes for birds – especially swifts - and hedgehogs. We are delighted that hedgehog numbers seem to be rising in the village – let's try to maintain the trend.

Other things residents could take part in are our "Adopt a Tree" scheme, still open for anyone wishing to help with their own part of the Community Copse, and we are always keen to hear of anyone who has an area of garden or verge in which they'd like to plant pollinator-friendly wildflowers. As part of this scheme, we are plan to produce wildflower plug plants (which we've found grow more successfully than seeds) which we will give away sometime towards the end of winter early in 2026.

The next one will be held on *Wednesday*, 14<sup>th</sup> January in the Parish Hall, starting at 7:00pm. Most meetings last for around an hour-and-a-half.:

At the last PC meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> November among the matters discussed were:

- Vacancy for a new councillor if you would like to be involved in making a
  positive difference to your community, to have a voice in the decisions made
  on your behalf and have a greater opportunity to hold Somerset Council to
  account, please contact the Parish Clerk at clerk@lydfordonfosseparish.gov.uk
  for more details.
- Neighbourhood Watch Lydford-on-Fosse no longer falls under Street's Community Policing Team and now comes under Shepton Mallet's Team instead. The Neighbourhood Watch Team are hoping to build as good a relationship with the team from Shepton as we have enjoyed with Tim, our PCSO from Street, prior to this change.
- The Theft of a 'Tommy' figure from East Lydford this was recently purchased with funds raised by Lydford on Fosse residents during the VE80 Commemoration in May this year. It appears to have been taken in broad daylight from its post next to the East Lydford War Memorial on the A37. The matter has been reported to the Police, and a suitable replacement was found in time for Remembrance Sunday.
- **Bleed Kits** The Parish now has 2 new Bleed Kits held in containers by the bridge in West Lydford and near to Lydford Crossroads. These will be monitored and maintained by the team that installed the Parish's defibrillators last year.
- Playground The Parish Council are currently looking for a suitable site for a
  new Playground as the one on the Sports Ground is nearing the end of its life.
  Once a location for this has been agreed, fund-raising for the new equipment
  will commence in earnest.
- Parish Council Budget The budget for the coming year, which is collected through Council Tax, was discussed and a recommendation was made to hold this at £14,000 for the third year in a row (representing a cost of £63.09 for a Band D Council Taxpayer). It was noted that this was well below the average Town/Parish Council Tax for Somerset of £111.00 a year. Councillors will have the opportunity to consider the Budget proposal in detail before voting on it at January's meeting.
- Correspondence A report was received from our local Somerset Council representative, Cllr. Claire Sully, and a summary of articles of interest ('SC Snippets') was also outlined at the meeting. #### **Lydford and District Gardening Club**

It may be difficult to believe, but there are those who look down upon the Lydfords in general and West Lydford in particular. Geographically this might be understandable with the bridge over the

Brue being only 20 metres above sea level - roughly. The alpine-esque pastures of Keinton Mandeville sit 30 metres higher whilst the peaks of Kingweston soar to the dizzy extremes of 75 metres and more above sea level. The air must be thin up in those parts. So, being 'on the bayou', West Lydfordians might be thought of as being sluggish, lacking sparkle, backward chawbacons whose idea of civilised entertainment is repeated screenings of the film 'Deliverance' accompanied by industrial quantities of moonshine with zydeco music and Tony Jo White albums being played on repeat.

Nothing could be further from the truth. West Lydford is a centre for cultural activities which expand the mind and, with some fairly serious biscuits, the waistline. This was evidenced at the November meeting of the Gardening Club when the speaker was Arthur Cole and he was talking about 'The Newt' with reference to its present form being the latest step on a journey which has lasted several millennia in broad terms and three centuries with specific reference to the gardens within the estate.

In the eighteenth century the original farmhouse at Hadspen was moulded into the 'perfect gentleman's seat' by a succession of prosperous Bristol merchants and lawyers and its grounds acquired fountains, tree-lined avenues and a ha-ha. From 1785 the estate was owned by the Hobhouse family and in the 1880s Margaret Hobhouse began to develop the garden in a naturalistic style. After a later period of neglect the famous garden designer, Penelope Hobhouse made her first garden here in the 1960s. Subsequently, in the 1980s and 1990s, Nori and Sandra Pope created their famous 'Colour Gardens' in the parabola-shaped walled garden. The most recent and most dramatic change occurred in 2013 when the 800 acre estate was purchased by a South African couple who spent a shed-load of money and created something unique. Many amazing features at 'The Newt' include a Roman villa, acres of finely trained apple trees, glorious ice-creams and, last but not least, a gathering of spitting toads or, as they are known to some younger people, squirty frogs!

Mr Cole spoke well and after a few technical teething problems showed some lovely photographs of white cattle and expensive cyder. He also managed to make reference to one of P.G. Wodehouse's more memorable character creations, the ardent newt-lover, Gussie Fink-Nottle. What Gussie did not know about the mating habits of these salamanders was simply not worth knowing!

But, to return to the popular fallacy that Lydford is a cultural desert, Mr.Cole also asked the audience to consider a few aspects of Roman and Greek mythology. No T.V. Soap operas, reality show celebrities or computer games referenced here but proper, solid and upstanding classical learning. Amongst the pantheon of Greek deities was a fairly rustic and minor god of fertility named Priapus. He developed such a following that the Romans adopted him and he became especially noted for his popularity amongst gardeners. Further details of this chap can be accessed from the well-thumbed multi-volume copy of the Encyclopaedia Britannica that sits on the shelves of the front room or alternatively any informative website might be consulted.

We then moved on to the modest red-brick Georgian farmhouse, finishing our tour in the much grander stone farmhouse built in 1894.

Afterwards there was time to explore the permanent galleries at the museum which tell the story of rural life in Somerset, as well as a fascinating exhibition about the life and work of artist and writer Hope Bourn. Known as "The Lady of Exmoor", she spent sixty years on Exmoor recording the wildlife and natural landscape.

#### Christmas joy for all people

We fear that we live in a world of increasing polarisation. Conflicts between and within nations play their part. The amplification of division and hostility by social media algorithms doesn't help.

Culture wars exacerbate matters further. Sometimes it feels like common ground is disappearing from underneath our feet like a sandbar being overwhelmed by the tide.

In such a climate, it's good to return to the message that heralded the arrival of Jesus. *Thing you tidings of great joy which shall be for all people'* says that angel who announces the saviour's birth (Luke 2:10). Jesus' story quickly includes all types and sorts of humanity. From local shepherds to exotic visitors from afar. I wonder what the conversation was like as they all crammed into the stable to see the newborn child?

Jesus's story quickly shows that not only is he **for** all people but that he **needs** all people. His family must have needed assistance when they fled as refugees to Egypt. Jesus must have needed help when his parents left him behind on a family outing to Jerusalem aged twelve. Might we seek it for ourselves too? For joy breaks down divisions, overcomes barriers, reminds us that we are one. *'I bring you tidings of great joy which shall be for all people'* says the angel.
