Hello

I'm writing this at a time when the world feels like a slightly chaotic and uncertain place, and have no real sense of how to respond to what is happening around me, except to pray and keep trusting that in the end things will work out even though that seems a little unlikely. So it seems sensible to think about the things that I can do something about, like what plans are for Lent, which begins on 18 February this year?

I'm not good a '*giving up*' something for the 40 days, which is probably not a very good admission for an ordained person! In recent years I've tended to focus more on following a particular set of readings or reading a recommended book over the seven weeks.

There are a number of different alternatives, I'm currently looking at a Church of England App '*everyday Faith*' which is looking at '*Life Giving Habits*' for Lent: Worship, Prayer, Scriptures, Communion, Service (caring for one another) and Good News. This can be found by looking for Church of England Lent Course or here: <https://www.churchofengland.org/faith-life/what-we-believe/lent-holy-week-and-easter/draw-near-life-giving-habits-lent> Another Alternative is **Lectio 365** which has a series on the Desert Fathers and Mothers. You can find that in the *Lectio 365 App* available in your App Store.



Each week takes one of the 6 petitions of the Lord's Prayer, and presents a Bible passage and creative prayer idea for each day. Faith 'n Fun on the first Sunday of Lent will be creating *Thank you Jars*, so that people have ways to remember to be thankful, and things to be thankful for! That will be in Keinton Churchyard at 4:00pm on 22nd February.

However you spend Lent and whatever you choose to do, or not do may it be a time to explore and wonder about faith, and prepare for Easter celebrations.

We are planning on more "**environmental**" talks in the future and currently working on our spring dates. If you have any expertise on an environmentally-related topic *or know someone else who has do let us know*; we are always on the look-out for new speakers. The aim of these events is for KEG to raise funds for environmental projects around the village. Currently, we are undertaking maintenance on the Community Copse and local hedgerows, as well as extending our wildflower planting scheme. We would also love to get the community involved in promoting boxes for birds – especially swifts - and hedgehogs.

As part of this scheme, we are aiming to produce wildflower plug plants (*which we've found grow more successfully than seeds*) which we will give away sometime in the coming Spring – which is the next window for wildflower planting.

Require a Volunteer Coordinator

Wheathill Priory Community Transport provides a vital service for those who are unable to access transport for journeys to the doctor, dentist, hospital etc.

We need a volunteer Coordinator whose job would be to answer the dedicated Community Transport telephone, take down the details of the transport required and contact our volunteer drivers by WhatsApp or phone to allocate jobs. Once a volunteer driver is identified, the Coordinator notifies the client, advises them of the charge for the journey and the name of their driver.

We average approximately 22 calls per month for this service which we provide to the residents of Keinton Mandeville, Kingweston, Lydford and Barton.



St Peters Church Bells, West Lydford

As mentioned above we are having to carry out some maintenance and restoration work on the bells in St Peters Church West Lydford. This is going to **cost in the region of £12000.** We are applying for grants to help fund this, as well as from PCC funds and our own fund raising efforts, like the Tea and Talk mentioned above. We already have £1500 towards the cost from one very generous grant and funds the bell ringers already have.

The tower will be open for visiting, where those who are able will be able to go up the tower to see the bells and the work we are aiming to have carried out.

You will also be able to look around the tower, pull a rope, and we will have a display of the work that needs to be carried out. Teas, Coffee and cakes will be available *Do come along if only to see how bells are rung, and have a coffee.*

The Parish Council usually meets on the 2nd Wednesday of the month in Lydford Parish Hall at 7:00pm. Future Meetings will be held on Wednesday, 11th February and 11th March in the Parish Hall, starting at 7:00 PM. Most meetings last for around an hour-and-a-half, and everyone is welcome to attend. Please also note **Lydford on Fosse Annual Parish Meeting** will be on **Wednesday 8th April at 7:00pm**.

Become a Parish Councillor – and maybe save a life or a home!

Lydford on Fosse Parish Council currently has 2 vacancies, and we would therefore welcome expressions of interest in filling these positions. The following article outlines what the PC does and what the role of a Parish Councillor involves.

What does the Parish Council do? –The main responsibilities of the Parish Council are: – **Looking after the interests of our Parish & its residents** – through commenting on planning applications within the Parish, and by promoting the resilience and wellbeing of the community. Currently, Lydford on Fosse PC's main priorities are:

1. *Safety* – by enhancing road safety measures and installing emergency response equipment such as Defibrillators and Bleed Kits. Just last month, one of our new defibrillators was used to help save the life of a Parishioner (though the team at the Cross Keys deserve full credit for their swift & expert actions).
2. *Protecting homes and businesses* – by working to reduce the risk of flooding and by being ready to respond as a community when flooding does occur. But we also aim to ensure that Somerset Council's Planning Team understand the impact of proposed developments on quality of life of our residents and their implications for businesses within our Parish.
3. *Wellbeing* – Through environmental protection, the maintenance of footpaths and by working with community groups such as the Church, the Sports Club and the Forest Gardens.
- *Holding Somerset Council to account locally* – by striving to ensure that they provide the services and support to the Lydfords that your Council Tax pays for, and that they understand our community's specific needs and interests when making decisions that affect it.
- *Consultation & Policy Input* – by providing comment at the consultation stage on local and national policies and initiatives. For example, last year we provided input on the draft Somerset Local Plan which will set the basis on which our Parish will be developed out to 2049, the Local Transport Plan for the next 20 years.

What does a Parish Councillor do? The role is very varied, but you are always working as a team with the other members of the Council to make decisions and to look after the interests of the community. Most members have a specific role – *such as Highways, Planning, Footpaths or Communications* – this means that they usually introduce and outline any issues from their respective area to the Parish Council so that it can be discussed and any necessary decisions made collectively. The PC are also supported by an excellent Clerk who not only takes the minutes of our meetings, but also ensures that PC meetings are conducted appropriately, and that our budget is properly managed.

Who can be a Parish Councillor? Anyone who is over 18 years of age and who lives or owns a property within the Parish, or within 3 miles of its boundary. But it is worth saying that the most effective PCs thrive on having a wide range of members – from different ages, backgrounds, professions, locations and so forth. So please don't think that you are not suitably qualified or experienced – it is your experience of living in Lydford on Fosse that will make our discussions richer and better informed and our decisions for the community more representative of the breadth of its residents and businesses.

What is the commitment? If you join the Parish Council, you will become a 'Public Officer', that means that you will be representing our community's interests (and definitely not your own !). To be able to do that effectively, you need to have the time to lead and liaise on your specific portfolio, and to read any papers that are circulated ahead of PC meetings – that probably means that you need to be able to dedicate around half-a-day every month to PC business.

Lydford and District Gardening Club

Roadside ditches were full, either because they had not been cleared since beer cost 25p per pint or due to the precipitation which had been falling incessantly for several millennia, or so it seemed. Breakfasts had begun to appear on well-scrubbed tables throughout this idyllic area of rural mid-Somerset. Healthy wholemeal toast and homemade marmalade jostled for space with bowls full of coco pops. E-mails and text messages were being scanned to check on all the important things which hadn't happened overnight and thoughts gradually turned to what the day ahead might hold. A lucky few were destined for the school bus; some began the daily ritual of procrastination before they eventually headed for the home office, previously known as the back bedroom; others keenly anticipated the challenges that a full appointments diary might bring and quite a few, those who had already put in a serious shift at whatever coal-face had been their career location, settled down with another cup of coffee and the crossword. Online scams – take action to stay safe online!

Criminals are experts at using technology to commit fraud. They can spend hours researching you and will use any information they find in their scams. *They might use phishing emails, cloned websites and fake social media or dating profiles to get your information.* They can then use this information to:

- Contact you and gain your trust, then convince you to make a payment or provide access to your accounts
- Set up accounts or take out loans in your name
- Access your accounts directly to steal money

Be mindful of what you share online

- *Check your online privacy settings and review what information is currently available online.*
- *Be mindful of what personal information you share on social media, online forums or dating apps.*
- Criminals can use any information they can find online in their scams.

These are just some examples of the information criminals might use in their scams: *full name, date of birth, home address, email address, phone number, card details and bank account numbers, details of recent transactions, or sensitive documents such as bills from service providers.* Even things like *the name of your first pet or the road you first lived on*, as these could be security questions on your accounts.

Use the internet safely

- Avoid clicking on links in emails or messages. *Criminals can use these links to capture your information. Always visit an organisation's website directly from your browser.*
- Be wary of clicking on adverts from websites and social media. *Criminals create convincing adverts that take you through to fake websites to capture your information or encourage you to make a purchase.*
- Criminals can create fake websites or clone the websites of legitimate organisations.
- Check for the 'closed padlock' symbol &/or https at the start of a website address, the 's' stands for 'secure'. *These don't guarantee the website is legitimate or reputable, but they do mean your connection to the website is secure, so any information you enter will be encrypted.*
- Be cautious of online approaches. *Criminals create fake profiles and accounts to reach out to you on social media, apps or forums.* They might try to strike up a relationship or offer you an exclusive investment. *Keep your guard up against people who contact you online and find out more about romance scams and investment scams.*

Keep your accounts secure

- Use strong and unique passwords to protect your online accounts.
- *Turn on 2-step verification to add an extra layer of security to any accounts that have your personal or financial information.*
- *Use antivirus software on your devices and keep your apps/software up to date.*
- *Don't use public Wi-Fi to access accounts that have your personal or financial information.*

Our extended family recently got together for a celebration. We were nine adults from 24-68, one toddler, and one dog, and it was glorious! The joy was simply in being together, whatever our age.

I sometimes wonder what would happen in the life of our churches if we could adopt the same outlook there? Each generation glad that the other is there. Each generation contributing something to the whole. Each generation looking to the interests of the others, making sure there was something that spoke to the others even if not to them.

The writer of the Chronicles records something you could miss if you weren't looking for it. In **2 Chronicles 20**, when Judah was facing attack from Ammon and Moab, King Jehoshaphat proclaimed a fast and summoned the people.
